### URANQUINTY WATER TOWER (photos page 3)

As most people are aware the official opening of the water tower mural took place on Thursday 24 August at the site. The weather was perfect, and we were honoured to have Julia Waters and members of her family attend. Julia is the daughter of Len Waters who is featured on the mural and was the only Aboriginal combat fighter pilot who trained at the RAAF Training Base in Uranquinty. Prior to the event a lot of work was carried out at the site to clean up the paths and remove weeds and plant new stock. Wagga Wagga City Council's 'One Tree for Me' program has been a great source of native plants and their team were at the Community Hall to provide plants for anyone who would like some.

Also attending were representatives from our sponsors Transgrid, Eastern Riverina Arts, Riverina Water, Origin Energy, the Mayor of Wagga Wagga City Council, Michael McCormack MP, Glen Braz, Air Vice Marshall Australia, representatives from the Wagga RAAF Base and RAAF Point Cook in Victoria, which is where the aircraft training continued after Uranguinty Airbase was decommissioned. Temora Aviation Museum sent a Wirraway aircraft for the flypast. As well, local residents and visitors, students from Uranguinty Public School and members of Uranquinty Progress Association were present. The event opened with a smoking ceremony and didgeridoo duet performed by a serving RAAF Airman and at the conclusion of the official proceedings we were treated to a flypast of a Wirraway aircraft flown by the grandson of a pilot who had trained (and trained others) at Uranquinty. The newly installed information signs were formally unveiled by Julia Waters and Glen Braz and morning tea was held at the Community Hall. The Quinty Evening CWA ladies did a terrific job and Quinty Bakery also supplied savouries. UPS students had an exhibition of artwork at the Hall which told the stories on the water tower.

It was a lovely opportunity to meet people with a connection to Uranquinty

and we were lucky to have good media coverage for the event which we are sure will encourage visitors to the village to learn about our history. Unfortunately, Damien Mitchell, the artist, was unable to attend as he is currently in the USA, but his parents came and were very proud of his work and the impact of the mural.

The memorial pavers have been laid at the water tower site and we are indebted to the Quinty Mens Shed for the hard work, next will be laying the pavers at the cenotaph site – all volunteers are welcome!

Our thanks to everyone involved in making the opening ceremony a special event and to the volunteers without whom it would not have happened. Our next task is to find funding to install roadside signage to the water tower to improve our hits on Google and Apple Maps! More photographs will be available on our website.

### WAGGA WAGGA CITY COUNCIL

#### Dunns Road

Due to safety concerns, Council has fully blocked all access to the Olympic Highway end of Dunns Road while further construction work is under way. A hard closure has been put in place at the western end in response to motorists blatantly disregarding road closure signs and driving through the road works site.

The construction site is a high-risk zone due to heavy machinery and workers on the road.

While road closures might be inconvenient; they are essential safety measures to protect the lives of both our construction workers and the public.



Police are maintaining a high presence in the area. Motorists who do the wrong thing face the possibility of receiving fines and, if they are involved in an accident, this could also affect their ability to make an insurance claim.

# Uranquinty Pre School News

This term we had a visit from Ben and Reptile Encounters. Ben brought a turtle, lizards, a snake and a baby crocodile. This was a great hands on experience for the children, as they were able to get up close to the reptiles and touch them.

We have also been enjoying our regular nature/neighbourhood walks. As the season changes, the children have noticed the birds and blossoms on the trees. We take a basket to collect any natural loose parts we can find. These have then been used for sorting/ classifying and making into sculptures.

For Science Week, we explored several of Pamela Allen's picture books. One of the stories the children particularly liked was 'Who Sank the Boat?'. This story evoked lots of ideas and theories about who did sink the boat and why it sank. The children have then been offered props from the story, so that they can revisit the story. This also helps build literacy skills as the children engage with texts (EYLF v.2 2022, Outcome 5).

During Science Week, we introduced the Beebot. This is a small robot that the children code by pushing the direction buttons. This took a little practice but, once the children understood the concept, they were able to work collaboratively with each other.

The children have mastered the Beebot so well, that we have been able to create our own grid mat using photos from our nature/neighbourhood walk.

At preschool, we plan and create environments that promote and support different types of play for children's active engagement, problem solving, agency, creativity and exploration.

When possible, we offer children natural materials that they can use for building, design and experimentation. A range of different shaped and coloured beach stones supported 'Rock Mushrooms', as the children explored balance, sorting and classification. All sorts of loose parts in the

## Uranquinty Power Station Update September 2023



Uranquinty Power Station (UPS) is owned and operated by Origin Energy. The station comprises four gas turbines with a total generating capacity of 640-megawatts (MW).

#### **Station Update**

We've been busy on-site ensuring systems, processes and equipment have handled the increased demand over the winter period.

The UPS team are also planning for rolling outage work across all units during early 2024 when we'll test generators, HV protection systems and electrical distribution switchgear and inspect the internal exhaust systems.

We are currently looking into new projects on site to maximise safety for our team and visitors, and to raise the efficiency of the station in anticipation of increased demands as coal fired power stations gradually exit the National Electricity Market.

Our team on site is undergoing some change following the recent resignation of our Plant Manager Paul Olsen after seven years of service. We are currently undertaking the recruitment process for Paul's replacement and will reach out to the community for a meet and greet once this appointment is made.

The potential acquisition of Origin by a Consortium consisting of Brookfield and MidOcean Energy continues to progress, with Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) currently assessing the proposal. There is no change to our operations, and we continue to remain focused on running UPS in a safe and efficient manner.

## **Community Safety Group**

## **History of the Uranquinty Bakery**

Uranquinty welcomes the new owners of the Quinty Bakery and farewells the Gillanders family, Paul, Tanya, Chelsea, Sage, Boston and Vienna.

Bakeries have been an important part of the village since the turn of the last century and the first baker was Mr Morgan who's shop was situated in King Street.

The old Post Office in Morgan Street (now a residence) was also a bakery.

In 1954 Sam and Ella Castle purchased the General store and Post Office and, when the baker retired, Sam took over the Bakery with the help of his son Malcolm. The small butcher shop next door was then purchased and Malcolm became the butcher.

The Post office distributed the local mail received from the daily mail train. Most mail was collected but farmers on the eastern side of the railway had theirs delivered 3 times a week.

Sam had contracts with the local Air Force base delivering bread and some groceries and later he arranged a similar contract with the Kapooka army base.

In 1969 Sam sadly passed away unexpectedly and Ella was forced to sell the store and move to Wagga Wagga.

The Federal hall (now the bakery) has also had its share of owners over the years. Built in 1900 it was the place for many special occasions and dances. In 1910, when the new hall was completed, Mr Hugh Campbell converted it into a store and residence.

Messrs Heydon and Beattie, operated a drapery, hardware and grocery store for many years followed by the Spaul family and lastly Alex Zvargalis who ran a garage and shop from 1958 until 1980 when he was forced to close the service station when the petrol tanks rusted out and filled with water.

In 2001 the building was purchased by Tanya Gillanders who along with her husband Paul, began the restoration and later opened their bakery, which still flourishes today.
