Progress Association News

URANQUINTY WATER TOWER

UPA is awaiting the outcome of Wagga City Council's annual community grants awards, fingers crossed we are successful in obtaining funding to erect road signage to the water tower.

WAGGA WAGGA CITY COUNCIL

Unfortunately, we have been unsuccessful in obtaining funding through Council's application to Crown Lands and also the Community Builders grants on behalf of UPA to provide funds for some Hall projects, which is disappointing.

Dunns Road

The upgrade has taken over thirty years to achieve but, now open, is proving extremely popular to access the airport and eastern Wagga.

Uranquinty Flood Plain Management Plan

Despite numerous requests we still have no update on the levee plan for Uranquinty. Council gave recent approval for the levee upgrade for North Wagga. As a result, UPA and the Uranquinty Community Safety Group have made a submission to Wagga City Council requesting a community meeting attended by representatives of Council, the consulting engineers and Riverina Water. The community needs to consider the final flood management plan and give input to Council. It is frustrating that flood management has been under consideration since the last major flood in 2012 yet a finalised solution has been hindered by lack of communication between residents and Council. We have provided Council with dates in July and August for a meeting and when it occurs will be publicised. It will be your chance to see the plans and have your say.

Upgrade, gave an in depth presentation on plans for the levee upgrade for the village, which was very welcome and there was a useful Q&A session. We will keep the community informed on developments. A further in-depth community consultation is planned in the near future.

YARRAGUNDRY ESTATE

We are pleased to report that the block of land within the boundaries of Yarragundry, Best, Uranquinty and King Streets has seen some much-needed action on installing drainage pipes around the block and between the end of King Street to the end of Baker Street, and under Baker Street and Yarragundry Street to the levee.

The developer has also provided the following information which may be of interest:

The land is owned by Fetesi Pty Ltd, Mick Neason and Phil Andrea. The earthworks company hope to have work completed in about a month, subject to the weather. The subdivision will then be sent off for registration.

The concert was organised by Eastern Riverina Arts with the support of live music tech and crew from the Wagga Wagga Civic Theatre. Admission was free to the public thanks to Wagga Wagga City Council. We hope to see more live music in the hall!

Riverina Conservatorium of Music Concert

This was our third year of hosting one of the Conservatorium's free concerts at the Uranquinty Community Hall, and it was lovely to see the Hall almost full to capacity. Discussions with WWCC staff have been ongoing regarding the unauthorised use of the oval by cars and horses. After inspection by UPA and Council staff, the chain on the gate to prevent car access has been replaced and we are waiting for the installation of signs saying horses are prohibited from using the oval.

TENNIS CLUB

The issue of the toilet block next to the Uranquinty Tennis Club was again raised and we are advised that plans to upgrade the block should be included for this year. It was emphasised that members of the Tennis Club should be involved in any upgrades and that a disabled toilet/change facility should also be included. Planning is well underway on this project after meeting with local reps.

We continue to assist the Progress Association with tasks such as installing new name plate pavers at the rest area, removing graffiti from the BBQ facilities at the rest area and providing sausage sizzles when requested by Progress.

We also assist residents of Uranquinty and organisations such as the Preschool, with various repair and restoration jobs. The sales of produce from our gardens continue to be well patronised.

URANQUINTY COMMUNITY SAFETY GROUP

The Uranquinty Community Safety Group works under the auspices of the SES. In the event of an emergency, we are notified by the SES of the nature of the emergency and advised what action the group is to take. We continue our close liaison with the SES, particularly in respect to the current weather situation. Our main focus is on early warning and assisting those in need.

Emergency equipment has been supplied by the SES and is located in a container within the Men's Shed grounds. Sand for sandbagging, should it be required in a rain event, is also available at the Men's Shed. We will be maintaining a small supply of sandbags positioned outside the Men's Shed perimeter next to the back entrance gate between the Men's Shed and the Neighbourhood Centre. These are available for emergency situations. Should a flooding event occur the Men's Shed will of course be opened.

We have received a grant to construct an all-weather shelter for filled sandbags and other equipment and outdoor lighting for the sandbagging area. Electrical work will commence within the next four weeks. The remaining work will follow electrical installation.

Uranquinty Power Station Update July 2024



Uranquinty Power Station (UPS) is owned and operated by Origin Energy. The station comprises four gas turbines with a total generating capacity of 640-megawatts (MW).

Station Update

We've been busy on-site ensuring our systems, processes, and equipment effectively handle the increased demand over the winter period.

The UPS team has scheduled minor maintenance activities for two units (GT11 and GT12) in June. This maintenance will involve various suppliers, including Siemens, AmpControl, Roddy Engineering, Paul Ryan Electrical, and others. The work will include mechanical inspections of the main combustion areas and exhaust of the gas turbines, as well as electrical maintenance activities such as switchboard inspections and HV protection tests.

Ongoing improvement projects at the power station are crucial for maintaining reliability and safe operation. Some of the more notable initiatives include reusing the storm water to minimise the consumption of potable water and the upgrade of the pressure regulators in the gas yard. These initiatives will help to maximise the efficiency of the power station.

Uranquinty Power Station will continue operating during peak hours in the morning and afternoon, to support delivery of reliable electricity to the grid.

His early education at North Wagga Public School and Wagga High School laid the foundation for a life rich in community and craftsmanship.

A Humble Beginning Ron often reminisced about his simple and joyful childhood, where his trusty horse, Silver, was a constant companion. After finishing school, Ron embarked on a career in carpentry, securing an apprenticeship with the Public Works. His work took him to various schools and police stations, honing his skills and deepening his love for the trade.

Building a Legacy Ron's commitment to his craft was evident when he earned his Clerk of Works and builder's license after three years of night classes. This achievement marked the beginning of a successful partnership, forming the renowned duo Little and Parkin. In 1974, Ron and his wife Cheryl settled in Uranquinty, where he built the first brick veneer home in our town, a testament to Ron's skill and vision.

A Life of Hard Work and Love Ron was a dedicated family man, proud father to his children, Renée and Brad. His work ethic was unparalleled, as he tirelessly provided for his family while still making time for adventures and holidays. Trips to Sussex Inlet, Blowering Dam, and Goobagandra were filled with fishing, camping, and family fun.

A Passion for Music and Machinery Ron's love for Slim Dusty and country music was a defining feature of his life. He passed this passion on to his children, attending concerts and sharing stories behind the songs. His admiration extended to his love for Nissans and Kubota machinery, symbols of his hardworking and practical nature.

A Businessman at Heart Little and Parkin was a successful partnership, with Ron and Mick building many homes in our little town. After this, Ron ventured into the shed, roller door, insulation, and slashing business, founding A-line Garage Doors. His dedication to quality workmanship and his 'good bloke' nature earned him respect in the community. Ron was a member of many of our community organisations, even playing a few games for the 'Quinty Rosella's in his time and he was always willing to help anyone who needed it. Even in his leisure time, Ron found ways to be productive, working on his farm and giving a mate a hand.

Cherished Memories Ron's later years were filled with moments of joy and learning with his children and grandchildren. He was a pillar of support, teaching practical skills and life lessons. He loved weekends spent on his hobby farm with his dog and sheep. His sense of humour and love for family and friends, whether around a fire in the shed or paddock, or at the kitchen table, created lasting memories for all who knew him.

A Lasting Legacy Ron's legacy is one of hard work, love, and dedication. He leaves behind a family deeply touched by his kindness and wisdom. As his children and grandchildren continue to grow, they carry with them the values and lessons Ron imparted and lived by: hard work, kindness, and unwavering love. His presence remains in the hearts of those he touched, a testament to a life well lived.

Ron, Lorraine and their children Brae and Kabel moved to Uranquinty in June 1997 and took over the Hotel.

Ron had been a truck driver and in his youth a champion boxer, winning the Golden Glove.

After retirement the family lived in Pearson Street for some years before moving out to Settlers Village.

Barry Huxley

The local community has been saddened to learn of the passing of Barry Huxley, a life-long resident of the village and part of the fifth generation of the family that first moved of the area.

Barry was the eldest son of Vernon and Peg Huxley and brother of Susan and Daryl. He worked for many years for Telstra.

The history of the Huxley family goes back to Martin and Pauline Pumpa who moved to the area in the late 19th century from South Australia to where their great grandparents had migrated from Prussia in 1841.

Their daughter Matilda married Thomas Temple, a builder. They built a home near the old government tank on Mangoplah Road and Thomas built many of the homes in Uranquinty. Matilda's mother, Pauline, was the local midwife and delivered many of the town's babies including Matilda's daughter, Olive.

Olive married Harry Webber and, for a time, had a shop in the village on the site of the current Post Office. Olive lived for almost a century and her daughter Peg, who had married Vernon Huxley, was Barry's mother.

Barry married Carol Breed and they raised 3 children, Desmond, Linda and Jodie. Our thoughts are with his family and many friends.
