Progress Association News

ANNUAL GARAGE SALE

This year there were 17 properties included in the successful village sale held on Saturday 7 September and we should like to thank Origin Energy, Quinty Bakery and the Men's Shed for their support.

Lynda Blight hosted a fundraising stall at the Service Station to raise money for an AED (defibrillation) device to be installed on the wall of the service station. She and her volunteers had a wonderful start to fundraising and raised over \$450.00. We will be working with Wollundry Rotary to assist this device to be a reality. URANQUINTY WATER TOWER

UPA was successful in obtaining funding from Wagga City Council to install road signage to the water tower and the Committee are now working on getting this done as soon as possible to encourage visitors to the tower.

We have also been working with the Department of Communities & Justice to secure workers on community service orders to help with mantaining the eco-culural garden under the tower. All workers are supervised and all equipment, mowers etc are provided. We are working on a maintenance plan and planting many of the free native seedlings provided by Council's annual program to increase the number of native plants in the Wagga area. WAGGA WAGGA CITY COUNCIL

Uranguinty Floodplain and Levee Management Plan

A community meeting was held at the Hall on 13 August with Wagga City Council and the consulting engineer to present the final floodplain risk management plan for Uranguinty and the proposed upgrade of the levee for the village. This was a good opportunity for residents to highlight their own experiences in major floods and to advise what steps can be taken to mitigate the risk for those properties affected which Council and the engineers may have been unaware of when putting the plan together. Council will present the final version towards the end of the year and will advise UPA of developments.

Oval Ongoing discussions on the unauthorised use of the oval by cars and horses led to an inspection by UPA and Council staff. The chain on the gate to prevent car access has been replaced and we await a sign saying horses are prohibited. Oval Toilet Block See separate story and photos on page 3.

YARRAGUNDRY ESTATE

Completion of kerb and guttering and stabilisation of the corner at King and Yarragundry streets has been continuing for the block of land within the boundaries of Yarragundry, Best, Uranquintry and King Streets. This has proved to be a particularly difficult section to seal over winter because of the nature of the subsoil, but the warmer, drier weather has helped. The earthmoving company, Burgess, hope to have everything completed in the next six weeks and then power and phone connections can be put in place.

URANQUINTY COMMUNITY SAFETY GROUP

Page 1

The Uranquinty Community Safety Group works under the auspices of the SES. In the event of an emergency, we are notified by the SES of the nature of the emergency and advised what action the group is to take.

We continue our close liaison with the SES, particularly in respect to the current weather situation.

Our main focus is on early warning and assisting those in need. Emergency equipment has been supplied by the SES and is located in a container within the Men's Shed grounds. Sand for sandbagging, should it be required in a rain event, is also available at the Men's Shed. A small supply of sandbags for emergencies is outside the Men's Shed perimeter next to the back entrance gate between the Men's Shed and the Neighbourhood Centre. Should a flooding event occur the Men's Shed will of course be opened.

We have received a grant to construct an all-weather shelter for filled sandbags and other equipment and outdoor lighting for the sandbagging area. WWCC has assisted UCSG in applying for a state government grant from Reconstruction NSW for equipment including two four inch trash pumps, petrol driven high pressure cleaners, petrol driven generators and a trailer. It was then decided to extend this application to include the same equipment for Oura and North Wagga safety groups. We are waiting to hear the result of this application.

Approval from WWCC for 15m extension of land on our northern boundary was granted and we have completed the fencing of the new area. We are now in the process of constructing a timber and metal storage area on the eastern side of our container. This will allow us to clear the space on the northern side of the main shed to erect a skillion roof to accommodate a new metal working area.


The new prefabricated amenities have been ordered, similar to the photo below located at Norman Duck Oval with the addition of the installation of a Ergolet XY Gantry Ceiling Hoist Tracking System with a 275kg SWL fixed Luna Ceiling Hoist Complete System and a change table.

Delivery expected February-March 2025.

Concrete foundation slab, plumbing and electrical will organised prior. Demolition of old toilet block is now planned to be undertaken before concrete foundation slab is installed.

Temporary fencing and portaloos will be in place for the duration of works. Portaloos are planned to be located between old amenities and fence under gum trees. A site meeting will be required with Skye to confirm location in coming weeks.

Location of new amenities is now slightly closer to the road.



LOCAL HISTORY

Uranquinty Progress Association

With the Progress Association Annual General meeting coming up soon, it is interesting to look back at the origins of the Association.

There has been a Progress Association in Uranquinty since about the mid 1890's. Many of the early infrastructure and improvements made during the foundation of the village came from requests and petitions from the members of the association.

Some of the main items on their agenda back then were to have the town road formed, a school masters residence built next to the new school which had just been built "because the town was entitled to a married teacher in order to teach the girls needlework".

They also petitioned the Department of Railways to build some stock loading yards at the railway station so that local farmers did not have to walk their stock to The Rock or to Wagga. They also petitioned the Roads Superintendent for a bridge over Sandy Creek as residents were sometimes stranded for days when the creek flooded.

By 1917 they had successfully arranged for some street lighting and a formed road from the village to the "Connorton gates".

Other services requested by the Progress Association and eventually provided were a telephone service and a sanitary service.

The Association went into recess on numerous occasions including the First World War, reforming in 1932 to successfully connect the village to Burrinjuck Electricity and install street lights but they were unable to obtain a water supply.

After a lapse during the Second World War, a meeting was called in September 1945 and although there were many eager members, it didn't last and another recess occurred.

In April 1952 a new lot of residents called a meeting and 74 residents came and signed up. The new committee comprised of President Mr R Dickson (local store owner), Secretary Mr Gordon Campey (school teacher) and Treasurer Mr W Taber, father of StanTaber who became secretary for many years later on.

During this period many trees were planted around the village, a playground was built in Morgan Street (now known as Campey Park), in honour of the school master and long time secretary. Mr Campey passed away in 1960 and a two minutes silence was held at the next meeting. From 1973 to 1978 and from 1988 to 1993, meetings once again lapsed but in this time Uranquinty was able to achieve the Neighborhood Centre, a levee bank around the creek, a sewerage system, a quarterly newsletter which is still in production and many fun events like the Family Fair, Back to Uranquinty Reunion, garden competitions, the water tower mural and now a brand new toilet block for the football oval, playground and tennis club.

So if you want to see more improvements in our local area, the place to be is the Uranquinty Progress Association.
