URANQUINTY WATER TOWER

UPA was successful in obtaining funding from Wagga City Council to install road signage to the water tower and the Committee are now working on getting this done as soon as possible to encourage visitors to the tower.

Tower grounds maintenance Community Service workers are now helping to keep the area around the water tower tidy and reecent rain has encouraged good growth in the native garden there. If you can spare a little time Deb would love to hear from you if you can help with watering over summer.

Promotion We are working with Eastern Riverina Arts and Lauren Reynolds from Wagga Wagga City Council to help boost Cultural Tourism Content for this region, and were approached by a media company engaged by Council to gather stories, images and video to increase the visibility of cultural treasures and encourage exploration of the area. They wanted to include the Uranguinty Water Tower Mural in their filming schedule so Deb Bewick, Jenny Lewington and Christine Stewart met with the team on 5 November for interviews and a video shoot. The photos and video gathered will be used to promote arts and culture across the region and will also be made available to UPA, Wagga Wagga City Council, and cultural and tourism promotional libraries of organisations like Destination NSW. The filming was done on a perfect Spring day and we look forward to seeing the results once the final edit has been done.

Visit Wagga Deb Bewick and Christine Stewart attended the Visit Wagga Tourism Partner Program end of year networking event at Magpie's Nest on Wednesday 4 December which was a great opportunity to network with team Visit Wagga Wagga and fellow industry colleagues and gain insights into upcoming tourism strategies, programs and opportunities for 2025.

Uranquinty Floodplain and Levee Management Plan

We are still to be advised if the final plan has been submitted and approved by Council. UPA will keep the community informed as soon as we have any information to share.

General Maintenance

Discussions with WWCC staff have been ongoing regarding the unauthorised use of the oval by cars and horses. After inspection by UPA and Council staff, the chain on the gate to prevent car access has been replaced and signs saying horses are prohibited from using the oval are now installed.

Oval Toilet Block Plans for the renewal of the toilet block next to the Uranquinty Tennis Club have been finalised and it is hoped that the upgrade will be completed soon. They have started a couple of months ahead of schedule. And shade sails are being installed over the playground.

YARRAGUNDRY ESTATE

We are pleased to report that the completion of kerb and guttering and stabilisation of the corner at King and Yarragundry streets has been continuing for the block of land within the boundaries of Yarragundry, Best, Uranquintry and King Streets. The earthmoving company, Burgess, hope to have everything completed before the end of the year so that power and phone connections can be installed and the blocks advertised for sale.

Bookings for the hall continue to service a range of events from family gatherings, gentle exercise classes, yoga classes, CWA meetings and business meetings. The Quinty Folk Festival took place over the October long weekend, another successful event for them and for the Quinty community. Term 4 is a busy time at Uranquinty Preschool. We have many children who are preparing to go to school, so we offer the children more challenging experiences that include concept games, STEM inspired experiences and puzzles.

This term we have been exploring light through transparent 3D shapes on the light table and touch lamps in the block area. When children are given the opportunities to play with light there are more questions than answers. The touch lamps have been used in many different ways including being hidden under block buildings or standing up high like a lighthouse.

The tactile qualities of clay have invited playfulness and experimentation. Clay requires effort, strength, muscle and tenacity. It is a medium that invites unexpected discoveries and creative inventions from the children.

We have been very excited with how the children have taken to the medium and used it effectively to express their thinking and ideas.

The children have also been exploring different types of painting. We have offered painting beyond the easel with different types of materials.

We recently had a visit from Sam with Reptile Encounters. Sam came with different types of lizards, a turtle, crocodile and a python. Sam told us all about these reptiles including where they live and how they protect themselves from predators. Sam made it very clear that you must not touch reptiles in the wild.

Uranquinty Power Station (UPS) is owned and operated by Origin Energy. The station comprises four gas turbines with a total generating capacity of 640-megawatts (MW).

Station Update

We've been busy on-site ensuring systems, processes, and equipment can safely and reliability operate over the coming summer period.

During October, we performed a total power station outage and focused maintenance and inspection activities on the gas yard, gas turbines and switchboard. Our teams are not planning for the next major maintenance outage which is scheduled for the middle of 2025.

During the holiday period, Brent Blackstock (December) and Peter Hillyard (January) will be acting as UPS Plant Managers. The UPS team hopes you have a wonderful year-end and wishes you and your family a Merry Christmas and a memorable time.

HISTORY OF EDUCATION IN URANQUINTY

Looking back on 145 years of education at Uranquinty, newer residents may not know that our public School wasn't always at the present address. The original school, known as The Sandy Creek School, was located on Hanging Rock Road 2.5 km west of the village. Hanging Rock Road was the main Cobb and Co road between The Rock and Wagga Wagga, before the railway line was built and the village was inhabited.

Situated on the Pomingalarna Run, an area of 0.8 ha was purchased by the Council of Education for public school purposes. The school and attached residence were of substantial brick construction and opened in 1880. The first teacher was Robert Stratton, born in Southern Ireland in 1841 and arriving in Australia in 1860. He married Marian Grant in 1866 and was appointed as the first teacher at the Cudgewa Creek School in between 1872 and 1877. In 1880, Robert and his wife and seven of his children moved to the Sandy Creek School and remained there until 1889. His wages and all the equipment needed for the school were paid for by the parents of the children who attended. These children came from the surrounding farms and either rode their horses, walked or were driven by horse and cart up the 'school hill' as it was called . Numbers reached upwards of 40 pupils at various times.



making tea over an open fireplace when the dress she was wearing caught fire. She was immediately engulfed in flames, with her aged father trying to save her. Her sister in law went to her aid after she had rushed out of the building, throwing a blanket around her and smothered the flames. Florence was taken to Tumut hospital for treatment. Robert, who sustained burns to his hands and face was brought to Wagga to the District Hospital but passed away 3 days later. He is buried in the Wagga Wagga cemetery.

By 1897, the village was growing and the residents began to petition the **Education Council** to move the school to the village. A site was selected close to the railway station and a new school built, opening in 1900. After the new school opened, the original building was relocated to Ben Street in Uranguinty. Its front step is now at the front gate of the new school. In 1916 Robert Stratton was living at Taradale, near Tumbarumba, where his daughter Florence was
