### Inland Rail and Rubbish Dump on Highway

Many residents will be aware of the assorted rubbish which can be seen piled up alongside the railway line as you approach the village from Wagga. After at least four years of frustrating attempts by UPA to get ARTC to do something about this unsightly mess, we have been advised recently by the Wagga office of ARTC that there is a plan to finally address this problem. With the ongoing work happening with Inland Rail, it has been agreed that the site will initially be protected with shadedcloth and the long-term plan is for ARTC to remove everything and rehabilitate and revegetate the area 'over the next year or two'. UPA will monitor progress and advise any updates. It's been a long and frustrating process to get anyone to accept responsibility for this eyesore but hopefully we are on the homeward stretch!



## URANQUINTY IN NEW VIDEO

### An Enduring Legacy: The Empire Air Training Scheme documentary

This documentary examines the importance of the Empire Air Training Scheme during the Second World War and the role that the Flight Training schools played in creating a wartime air force that by the end of the war became the fourth largest air force in the world. No 5 SFTS Uranquinty is included along with 4 other local bases.

The film crew spent a whole day filming the base and recording the history of the Lewington's struggle with the resumption of part of their farm and the long process to finally buy their land back.

## Uranquinty Pre School News



During Term 4, we are busy at preschool supporting children to prepare for school. This involves talking about school, practicing opening packets of food, looking after their belongings and challenging them with experiences where they can work in small groups or individually.

The children have been enjoying the challenge of our new Crystal Polydron blocks. The children construct 2D and 3D shapes while building mathematical concepts such as geometry, problem solving, number and classifying.

We recently welcomed Ben Sharp to preschool. Ben runs Little Champions which is like a mobile children's gym. Ben has a preschool program which was perfect for our children's gross motor development. The children listened carefully and followed all Ben's instructions which included doing a bunny hop, rolling tightly down the padded mat and swinging on the rings.

We have renewed our Little Scientists House Certification for another period. To receive this certification we needed to demonstrate that we are committed to inquiry based learning. We had been working on a project throughout the year which was around light and colour. The project began with the question How do you make different colours? To answer the question and explore light and colour, the children were offered experiences that allowed them to investigate, test hypotheses and collaborate. We did answer the question and concluded that the primary colours could be mixed to together to make many new colours. With light, we could reflect colour throughout our room.

Looking ahead, we are exploring several new projects aimed at enhancing safety for both staff and visitors, while also improving the station's efficiency as the energy landscape continues to evolve with the ongoing retirement of coal-fired power stations.

### Saturday: Fire Safety Familiarisation at Uranquinty Power Station (UPS)



On Saturday morning, the Origin team welcomed 35 members from the Rural Fire Brigade Services (Uranquinty, Yarrangundry, and Glenfield) and Fire and Rescue NSW to UPS for a site familiarisation session.

Leading the day was Barry Menz, a long-time Origin employee who knows the Station like the back of his hand. Barry shared invaluable insights on site layout, emergency access points, and safety systems.

Highlights included:

- Seeing the turbine up close, a jaw dropping experience for many.
- Exploring our advanced fire panel, the central control system for detecting smoke or fire and triggering alarms. This gave crews a deeper understanding of our safety systems and where to respond during an emergency.
- Confirming access to the fill point, a critical resource for quick water refills during fire emergencies, something the teams truly appreciated.



## URANQUINTY'S EARLY SETTLERS: WILLIAM FRY STONE AND ARCHIBALD LEWINGTON



One of the first families to settle in the Uranquinty area was William (Bill) Fry Stone, his wife Jane and his 10 children who settled at 'Springwood' which he purchased in 1891. William arrived in Australia in 1878 and, after coming to the Wagga Wagga area, he met and married Jane Cox from Gregadoo in 1885. The family was very actively involved in the village and was one of the first 8 subscribers to the Uranquinty telephone exchange. Their children were among the first students to attend the Sandy Creek School on Hanging Rock Road and the Uranquinty Public School, built in 1900.

When the chaff mill was built in Yarragundry Street in 1921, most of the water that the mill needed was carted from 'Springwood' by Bill and his son Fred, until a dam was constructed on a vacant lot next door. In January 1905 a dreadful fire started on 'Pomingalarna' station and then another at Sandy Creek Station and Bill had come home for a few hours sleep after helping with the first fire. His young son had seen the fire crossing the railway line and entering their farm and tried to save some horses but had fainted from the heat. His young daughter then began throwing buckets of water around the house and more on her brother to revive him. Her pinafore had caught fire along with her dress but she quickly discarded them and raced to the carriage shed to rescue a poddy calf with its fur alight, also throwing buckets of water on it. Mr Stone managed to save his house, but all his machinery and vehicles were burnt along with all his stacks of hay. Luckily his stock was saved but it was on his property that the two fires met, and the flames were over 7 metres high and burnt many more farms before being finally stopped in the vicinity of 'Rosewood' on the Tumbarumba Road.

William Fry's eldest daughter Annie met and married Archibald Lewington in 1910 at the original St Cuthberts Church in Yarragundry Street. Archibald was the fourth son of John Lewington who had emigrated from England in 1849 and lived at Bundalong near Yarrawonga along with his wife Charlotte. He had met Charlotte on the voyage to Australia and she was to become a maid at Peechelba Station, so John followed her there and obtained a job as a groom.

Archibald Lewington left home at the age of 12, running away in the middle of the night because his older brothers were picking on him. He finished up on a farm with two old maids who took him in to work for them. He later joined a shearing team as a tar boy and went on to become a gun shearer, shearing at Brookong the night of the big shearer's strike. Not wanting to become involved, he packed up and once again rode off in the middle of the night.

Archibald went onto buy and sell various selections and then decided he wanted to own a farm near Wagga Wagga within hearing distance of a train whistle.

So in 1906 he bought 1300 acres (526 ha) called 'Texas' for four pounds an acre and began growing crops to be cut for hay. Up to 12 men were employed to help cut and stook the hay in summer then cut the chaff in winter.

After a few years another 1000 acres (400 ha) was bought from various neighbors and in 1925 he purchased 'Pine Grove', 180 acres (73 ha) for 7 pounds an acre. His final addition was 'Bon Accord' in 1928.

During harvest, about 30 men would be employed along with a cook working out of a mobile cooking galley. Archibald and Annie lived at Texas until 1928 when they moved to Pine Grove and raised 4 children. Fred 1912, Archibald 1916, Jean 1918 and James in 1925.

During this time the Kywong rail line was built and there were plenty of men employed to construct it using horses pulling scoops, picks and shovels and wheelbarrows. They had a large camp in the corner of the Quinty paddock, next to the creek and were a rough and rowdy lot with lots of fights. Four policemen were stationed in the village and unfortunately there was a large riot one night and one of the navies was shot by the police.

Archibald always used horses and bred Clydesdales, often winning prizes at the Wagga Wagga show with his stallions. He purchased a car in 1922 but didn't like driving it so he went back to his sulky and let his wife Annie do the driving. The first tractor was bought for the farm in 1942, but he refused to have anything to do with it and his son Archibald was the last farmer in the district to yoke up a horse team in 1956.

In 1940 the farm which then consisted of 4000 acres (1600ha) was broken up when 1000 acres (400ha) was resumed for the Air Force base. It took nearly 4 years for the government to pay the final compensation amount.

## LOUIS ARCHIBALD LEWINGTON

It is with deep sadness that the Lewington Family pay tribute to long time local farmer and surveyor, Lou Lewington who passed away recently after a hard fought battle against sun cancer, aged 79 years. Lou grew up at Bon Accord, the youngest of 5 children to Arch and Virge Lewington. He attended Uranquinty Public School followed by the Christian Brothers in Wagga, finishing off at St Joseph's, Hunter's Hill. With 3 older brothers already on the farm, Lou decided to enrol in surveying at the University of NSW in 1962.

During his final year he gained a cadetship with the DMR (now Transport and Main Roads) and worked on many different projects including the Newcastle Freeway, the Wollongong Expressway and the Snowy Mountains Highway.

Moving back to Uranquinty in 1973, Lou worked for the Soil Conservation Authority and the Ardlethan Tin Mine, before taking up a position with a private survey firm attached to the Albury Development Company. In 1978 the family moved back to Uranquinty and Lou set up his own survey practice which he ran successfully until his retirement in 2019.

Returning to full time farming after his son Derek's accident, he gained his semi-trailer license and was a familiar face at The Rock grain depot at harvest time. Always keen to keep fit, Lou could often be seen riding his push bike, Jogging or later on walking many of the local roads sometimes up to 10 km at a time.



Lou was recently awarded a long service medal for being a member of the Uranquinty Fire Brigade and was always willing to help out with projects around the neighbourhood including surveying and working bees. He will be greatly missed by all his family and friends.

Archibald Lewington passed away in 1947 and never got to see his farm restored.

His son Archibald Junior was finally able to purchase the land back in 1964, except for 3 small hobby farms that had been subdivided off.

Archibald Lewington's great grandson Derek purchased 'Pine Grove' in 2006 and lives there now.
